Weeks 1 and 2 - Grammar

Jouer and faire

To talk about sport we use two verbs - 'jouer' and 'faire'.

- Jouer is a regular -er verb - you've seen the endings before. It is followed by **au/à la/aux**.
- Faire is an irregular verb—you need to learn the endings by heart. It is followed by **du/de la/des**.

	jouer—to play		faire—to do
je	joue	I play	je fais I do
tu	joues	you play	tu fais you do
il/elle	joue	he/she plays	il/elle fait he/she does
nous	jouons	we play	nous faisons we do
vous	jouez	you (pl) play	vous faites you do
ils/elles	jouent	they play	ils/elles font they do

Weeks 3 and 4 -

-er verbs in the past tense

To put an -er verb in the perfect (past) tense you need three things:

- The noun or pronoun (je/tu/il/elle/nous/vous/ils/elles).**
- The verb 'avoir' (to have) in the present tense.**
- A past participle (remove the -er and replace with -é).**

For example: **Nous avons joué** -> We have played

Pronoun:	Avoir:	Past participle:
j'	ai	joué (played)
tu	as	regardé (watched)
il/elle	a	visité (visited)
nous	avons	
vous	avez	
ils/elles	ont	

Weeks 5 and 6 - Grammar

Irregular past participles

All past tense verbs need:

- The noun or pronoun (je/tu/il/elle/nous/vous/ils/elles).**
- The verb 'avoir' (to have) in the present tense.**
- A past participle**

However, not all past participles follow a regular pattern. You will need to learn the following past participles by heart:

- Nous avons bu - We have drunk**
- Nous avons écrit - We have written**
- Nous avons fait - We have done**
- Nous avons lu - We have read**
- Nous avons vu - We have seen**
